The requirements listed below reflect the undergraduate major curricular changes approved by the Catalog Subcommittee since approval of the last Undergraduate Major Change Bulletin. All changes are underlined. Deletions are crossed out. The column to the far right indicates the date each change becomes effective. Note: Items marked {S} have been streamlined and do not require Catalog Subcommittee review.

<b>Business</b> Add new undergraduate certificate on the Everett, Global, Pullman, Tri Cities, and Vancouver campuses: Aging Business Management	<b>Aging Business Management</b>  The certificate in Aging Business Management is open to all non-Hospitality Business Management majors. To complete the certificate, students must complete 15 credits, consisting of four core courses and one additional elective, with a GPA of 2.0 or higher. Required core courses include: ACCTG 220 or 230, HBM 270, HBM 470, and HBM 475. Fulfillment of the elective emphasis course requires completion of one of the following: H D 308, 309, 350, 360; PSYCH 363.	8-26
<b>Business</b> Add new undergraduate certificate on the Everett, Global, Pullman, Tri Cities, and Vancouver campuses: Human Resources	<b>Human Resources</b>  The certificate in Human Resources is open to all Carson College of Business majors. This program prepares students for careers that focus on human resources. To complete the certificate, students must complete 15 credits, consisting of four core courses and one additional emphasis course, with a GPA of 2.5 or higher. Required core courses include MGMT 415 or CES 207, MGMT 450, MGMT 455, and MGMT 456. Fulfillment of the emphasis courses requires completion of MGMT 401 or MGMT 485.	8-26
<b>Business</b> Add new undergraduate certificate on the Everett, Global, Pullman, Tri Cities, and Vancouver campuses: Innovation and Change	<b>Innovation and Change</b>  The certificate in Innovation and Change is open to all Carson College of Business majors. This program prepares students for careers that focus on innovation and change. To complete the certificate, students must complete 15 credits, consisting of three core courses and two additional electives, with a GPA of 2.5 or higher. Required core courses include MGMT 483, MGMT 487, and MIS 448. Fulfillment of elective emphasis courses requires completion of two of the following courses: MGMT 401, MGMT 415 or CES 207, MGMT 450, and MGMT 485.	8-26
{S} <b>Electrical Engineering and Computer Science</b> Revise requirements for minor in Electrical Engineering	<b>Electrical Engineering</b>  The minor in electrical engineering consists of <del>18</del> <u>17</u> credit-hours, 9 of which must be 300-400-level and earned in WSU courses or through WSU-approved education abroad or educational exchange courses. The <del>18</del> <u>17</u> credits must include the following courses: E E 214, 261, and 262. The remaining credits must be selected from any 300-400-level E E courses excluding E E 302 and E	8-26

	E 304. All prerequisites for minor courses must be met. The minor program must be approved by the electrical engineering undergraduate coordinator. For all courses and their prerequisites, a grade of C or better is required to complete the minor.	
<b>{S} Molecular Biosciences</b> Under BS in Biochemistry, drop Accelerated Pre-Pharmacy Option	<b>Biochemistry—Accelerated Pre-Pharmacy Option (135 Credits)</b>	<b>8-26</b>
<b>{S} Molecular Biosciences</b> Revise requirements for minor in Pre-Genetic Counseling	<b>Pre-Genetic Counseling</b>  A minor in pre-genetic counseling requires <del>19–23 hours</del> <u>18-19 credits</u> including MBIOS 301, 423, PHIL 365, PSYCH 321 or 333, 440 or 444, <del>445</del> , one of PSYCH 311, STAT 212, 360, or 412. A grade of C or better is required in all course work for the minor. <del>Credit-hours</del> for the minor must include <u>9 hours</u> credits of upper-division work earned in WSU courses or through WSU-approved education abroad or educational exchange courses.	<b>8-26</b>
